
Dear Sir,

I am writing to convey to you our great relief and satisfaction that the recent attempt at coup d'etat in Spain was defeated. We believe the King Juan Carlos played a vital role in defending the institutions of Spanish democracy and preventing a return to civil war.

We believe, however, that threats to Spain's elected government still remain. For our part we are watching carefully the political situation in Spain and we are prepared to do everything in our power to preserve and protect democracy and the rights of working people to freely organise in Spain.
